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on't we miss those days – when Diwali used to be a festival lovingly prepared for well in advance, in the good old fashioned way? Today's Diwali is still celebrated with family, but modern convenience and living means the practice of visiting everyone in the neighborhood with plates of sweetmeats is no longer done as intensely as before. Store bought sweetmeats have replaced the sweat and toil in the kitchen preparations for Diwali. However, the traditional favorites of shopping at Chatsworth Centre for gold jewelry, fine clothing, lamps and fireworks continues with the same excitement and

anticipation of the day. Virasha Ramgoolam, a mother of two of Silverglen said she was fortunate to be a stay at home mother and still tried to keep old traditions alive. I just want my children to remember the good old times we had," said Ramgoolam.

DR VISVAKUREN NAIDOO, THE POST/CHATSWORTH CENTRE /PHOENIX PLAZA BURSARY AWARD WINNER

veryone loves heroes, especially those who emerge from our dusty communities and go on to spread good in the world. We're not talking Bollywood heroism here, but more the real kind that makes us proud of our community of Chatsworth. And that is what Dr Visvakuren Naidoo is all about – the first winner of the The Post/Chatsworth Centre /Phoenix Plaza Bursary Award in 1991.

The C Factor caught up with him to find out how life has turned out...

Visvakuren Naidoo had the second best Matric results in the country at the time, yet, surprisingly, received only one bursary – a R3000 bursury award initiative which he used as a kick start to study medicine.

Today the soft spoken single doctor runs his own practice in Chatsworth and spends much of his spare time giving back, tutoring medical students and junior doctors in the community and assisting in medical outreach clinics. It's a feel good story – call it karma, uBuntu or the circle of life. It's an aspiring story of uplifting each other as we go along, building our community, brick by brick, skill by skill. One of three children, Visvakuren admits he was a reserved teenager. "My mother was a housewife and my father a teacher who took care of us along with some of our extended family, so financially it was tough. I took on part time jobs as a shelf packer to help financially where I could, and the rest of my time I spent studying, even on the bus.

That approach clearly paid off as he finished his matric with flying colours, and went off to study medicine at UKZN.

SURVIVING THE FINANCIAL BURDENS

Although the R3000 bursary was not enough to pay for his university fees, Visvakuren was glad that he had something that could relieve his parents of the financial burden and used his bursary money to buy first year textbooks.

STAYING OUT OF TROUBLE

With drugs a prevalent challenge in Chatsworth, Visvakuren recalls how he resisted pressure from his peers. "Many thought that I was living a boring life, but it's important to get things into perspective, life doesn't mean going out to restaurants or frivolously wasting your time. Fun to me meant playing sport with friends. It's all about individual choices and the friends you choose to keep."

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AYURVEDA JUST WHAT GRANNY BEEN TELLING YOU ALL THESE YEARS!

ver wondered why your grandmother insisted you eat almonds during exam time or why at the slightest sign of a cold your mother would recommend some ginger milk?

Well, they are simply following age old Ayurveda recipes handed down from generation to generation – and seem to be taking modern medicine and the word by storm due to their success.

Almonds are high in protein and boost your ' memory power. Turmeric in milk when you have a cold is especially beneficial as, it is a natural antiseptic.

So the next time you reach for your medicine cupboard, consider these Ayurveda remedies first:

AIMMOSMI

Blend a cup of warm milk with four to five dates and a pinch of cinnamon powder. Sip at bedtime. Dates balance the nervous system and milk contains a natural compound that promotes sleep.

PERSISTENT COUGH

MUSCLE PAIN

Blushing Bride, HOT LOOK!

Your big day is around the corner and with all the preparation on the event, flowers and venue taken care of, it's now time to focus on the most important star attraction - YOU! The C Factor put together these easy steps to help take the stress out of the big day's make over routine for you so that you can be the stunning bride that you are meant to be...

BRIDAL BEAUTY MUSTS...

There's nothing more unsightly than unwanted hair! Book into a salon and embrace the pain of getting everything waxed – yes girls, we mean everything! A full-body wax is perfect as you will welcome the smooth hairless silhouette of your waist peering through your sari, and your henna will hold better on hands and feet with no hair.

Your face will need some special care, so wax or thread your eyebrows and upper lip depending on which you prefer (although beauticians swear that threading provides a cleaner, more refined finish!). Do this a week before so that any skin irritations have time to calm down and heal before the nuptials.

A rejuvenating facial can be done at least 48 hours before the big day to allow your skin to absorb the treatment and recover from any breakouts.

A manicure and pedicure a day before the wedding is ideal in ensuring it stays fresh and chip-free.

No matter what your eating habits, from at least 2 weeks before, try to eat healthily. Include lots of fresh fruit and vegetables in your diet and avoid all oily, greasy and fried foods. This will improve your skin from the inside and bring out inner radiance.

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PERFECT BRIDAL HENNA...

To begin, use the highest quality henna available which should ideally be applied 48 hours before your wedding day. Try using an experienced henna artist so there is little room for error.

Take care of everything that needs to done for the day, including visiting the loo and having your supper as you don't want to smudge your henna or ask someone else to feed you!

Select the design for both your hands and feet beforehand, and make sure that your artist is familiar with the pattern in advance.

Prepare a lemon and sugar paste just before you can apply your henna. Mix half a lemon with 3/4 tablespoons of sugar, add a drop of Eucalyptus oil and have this ready with some cotton-wool.

Ideally leave your henna on for at least 6 hours or overnight to ensure the darkest and richest color.

As the henna begins to dry, gently apply a little lemon-sugar paste to keep it moist, but don't smudge or put too much to cause it to drip. This seals in the henna and forms a protective laver thereafter.

Once the sugar seal is dry, wrap your hands and feet in cling film and leave this on all night. Remove the following morning and brush off the henna gently, removing all flakes of henna. Rinse your hands and feet thoroughly without soap and pat dry. Apply some Eucalyptus oil or Vicks to your hands and work it in. Leave this on from now.

Remember not to wash dishes or shampoo your hair thereafter; get someone else to do it for you. In fact don't immerse your hands in water or use any chemicals till after your wedding. On the morning of your wedding, visit your hairdresser and beautician as early as possible to get your hair and make-up done timeously. Now you're ready to take that leap of faith at marriage!

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THALI VEGETARIAN RESTAURANT

WHAT DO A PHARMACIST AND A CHARTERED ACCOUNTANT HAVE IN COMMON?

Well, they are business partners who share a passion for vegetarian food. In a bid to create a little piece of Chennai in the middle of Chatsworth, Pretoria based chartered accountant Mark Jeewan and Chatsworth based Jeremy Deokynarain and joined forces → to open up the Thali Pure Vegetarian restaurant in the heart of Chatsworth Centre Having travelled extensively through India, Mark said the name of the restaurant was easy to stumble upon - Thali - which means a plate or tray of a variety of food that typically includes rice, dhall, vegetable curries, roti, papad, curd, small amounts of pickle and a sweet dish to top it off.



"We decided to go vegetarian as there are not many vegetarian restaurants around in the area. While we largely caler for the Hare Krishna devolves by serving food that is prepared by initiated devotees and offered to God, our food does not cater only for this group," explains Mark.

With his mother Budhra Devi Dasi as head chef and Hari Valabh assisting her in the kitchen, the restaurant's menu boasts an extensive range from soya fish biryani, to paneer makhani, toasted soya polony and cheese sandwiches, to good-old fashioned snacks like samoosas, vedas and bhajia. Taking the restaurant to a new level, Mark has also catered for international events such as the Anup Jalota concert and the

recent Zee TV concert and teamed up with celebrity chef Asha Maharaj who has endorsed their menu. "We've been approached by international food company Arla to produce an instant paneer recipe and have been working on it for a year now so there's exciting things ahead for us and that includes a menu change, among other things!" added an upbeat Mark.

What are some of the challenges the school deals with?

Gordan Govender: The majority of our students come from impoverished or under privileged backgrounds so we have to deal with financial challenges with school fees and other issues like transport to school, nutrition and copina skills.

How do you address these?

Gordan Govender: We have a welfare club that arranges lunches for needy learners and we also arrange for uniforms and meal hampers from time to time. School fee exemptions are granted in special cases. Academically we arrange extra lessons in Maths on a Saturday to help learners experiencing problems in this area and also have a full time registered school counselor to guide learners with their careers.

What about the drugs issue, how is this handled?

Gordan Govender: We have zero tolerance for drug abuse and have a clear policy on substance abuse which parents sign and acknowledge when they register their child at our school. Drugs are a minimal issue at our school as we also have regular checks and engage with SAP to conduct sporadic searches. There have been a few cases and these were handed over to the SAP. We also have regular meetings with parents as they play a major supportive role and need to work closely with the school in tracking the progress of their children.



DEVELOP A POSITIVE MENTAL ATTITUDE

Don't entertain negative thoughts which will make you anxious. Practice a relaxation technique to calm you such as breathing, meditation or exercise at least 30 minutes each day.

STAY FOCUSED AND PLAN YOUR REVISION PROGRAM

Avoid any distractions when studying. Cell phones should be put away. Have a revision time table allocating adequate time to each subject and stick to it. It's best to study for one hour and take a 10 minute break and reflect on what you have revised.

GROUP STUDY

Engage in group study after school and over week-ends so that common problems can be resolved and seek the assistance of your teacher or tutor if necessary. Teachers are always willing to help.

DON'T TAKE STIMULANTS

Get enough sleep and DO NOT take medication to keep awake or study. Eat healthy, discuss problems affecting your studies with your parents, friends or teacher rather than letting it all build up.

REVIEW PAST PAPERS

This is essential. Sit down and answer the past three year's examination papers under exam conditions and mark your work. Check where you went wrong and seek help if you do not understand the work. Remember the more papers you work through the better your final performance.

FUTURE FIT

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A GOOD BUSINESS BEGINS WITH A GOOD BUSINESS PLAN

So... you've been thinking about starting your own business and want to take the final leap. The first thing you need is a sound business plan – a crucial aspect many people overlook when applying for startup capital. Here's a guide to get you started so that you don't waste valuable time and money.

THE CRITICAL BITS

very business plan must have an executive summary, business overview, company management outline, market analysis, sales and marketing strategy, and financial statements and cash flow projections,' says Bisson Girran, Operations Manager at The Small Enterprise Development Agency (Seda) in Durban. As part of the Department of Trade and Industry, Seda allocates funds to start-ups and small business based on business plans. The good news is they'll also help you formulate yours if you come unstuck. Take a look at what a good business plan should cover:

- EXECUTIVE SUMMARY this is important as it outlines your success strategy.
- BUSINESS OVERVIEW spells out the
 what, where, why and how it relates to your
 business. Describe the products or services
 you'll offer, your location, why you're a cutabove, and how you'll get there, including
 productions processes, capacity and current
 constraints.
- MANAGEMENT OUTLINE provide an organogram of company ownership and structure
- MARKET ANALYSIS who are your competitors? Where are the gaps for growth? This is your feasibility study.
- SALES AND MARKETING STRATEGY outline your pricing strategy and how you'll promote yourself.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND CASH
FLOW PROJECTIONS – this is a summary
of where you're at financially and what kind
of profit you expect to make by when. These
would be strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats relating to your venture.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

Attach your company credit records, identity documents, any documentation relating to copyrights, trademarks and copies of your company registration to your proposal. You'll be advised if anything further is required. Demonstrate knowledge of your industry and a determination to succeed – it shows confidence in your plan.

FATAL EXCEPTIONS

Avoid overstating your cash flow projections and outline what contingent plans you can put in place in the event things don't go so well. Also don't ask a consultant to write up your plan without providing input; if questions are put to you and you don't understand the contents of your own business plan you're unlikely to get the finance you're seeking.









Plan, research and be realistic about your expectations when drawing up your business plan!

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Although water covers nearly 70% of the earth's surface, 97.5% of it is salt water which we cannot drink! This means that only 1% of the planet's water can be used – not counting the glaciers which cannot be accessed. South Africa is facing a water shortage and is ranked number 30 amongst the driest countries in the world!

e've heard about it, but let's face it, not many of us seem too bothered with it. 'Going Green and being environmentally friendly' is something we often associate with the rich who don't have much else to worry about! The truth is going green is about saving our environment. We are running out of clean drinkable water, our air is making us sicker and the amount of land where we can grow food on is shrinking. Going green

means using fewer chemicals, less energy (which will save you money too) and reusing, recycling and reducing the amount of waste in the environment. In this first part of our series on Going Green, we feature the following tips on how you can save money on your water consumption and make a difference to saving our planet – after all, it's the only one we have! Let's make a start, let's Go Green in Chatsworth and lead the change!



TAKE SHORTER SHOWERS

Every minute less spent in the shower can save up to 23 litres of water, depending on the efficiency of your showerhead. The less water you use, the more money you save.

FIX THE LEAK

If you have a leaking tap, fix it immediately – it could be wasting up to 2,000 litres of water per month, and running up your water bill! Don't keep tightening the tap as this will wear out the washer and make the leak worse.

WASH FRUIT AND VEGETABLES IN A BOWL OF WATER OR HALF-FILLED SINK

This can reduce water consumption by 30 litres each time.

RUNNING THE WATER

Whenever you turn a tap on and are waiting for cold water to run, catch the cold water in a jug or bucket and then use it – for watering plants, filling the kettle, or any other purpose. This can save you up to 4 litres of water each time.

GARDENING

Don't water the garden during the heat of the day; instead water in the cool of the evening or in the morning. That way you will use water more efficiently as it won't dry up so easily by the sun.

GO FASY ON THE TOILET FLUSH

Reduce the flush on your toilet whenever appropriate. You can save about 8 litres per flush.

USING A FULL LOAD ON YOUR MACHINE

Use your washing machine with a full load. Reducing the number of washes you do can save huge amounts of water. Using your machine with half a load uses up water less efficiently and con-

sumer un-necessary energy.
Remember top-loading machines

can use up to 240 litres per wash!



When washing the car, use a bucket and sponge rather than a hose. Use just six buckets and you'll save more than 150 litres per wash!

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




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WHAT IS METHADONE?

t's a prescribed drug that's meant to shut down receptors effectively, which is why it's usually used to treat drug addiction.

SO HOW DOES ONE BECOME ADDICTED TO METHADONE IF THIS IS THE CASE?

Unfortunately these drugs are abused because they are so easily available. Although one needs a prescription, patients often go "doctor hopping" to get many prescriptions or buy it on the black market. A recovering addict can quickly become addicted when Methadone is not taken correctly, which is what we are seeing.

WHY DO ADDICTS RESORT TO SUICIDE LIKE THE RECENT CASE THAT MADE HEADLINES?

Some addicts are battling with their addiction and go to rehabilitation facilities which are sometimes unable to help. They are put in beds and left alone, which does not solve the problem. As a result, patients get frustrated, helpless and resort to suicide. Addicts need interactive help to succeed.

WHAT IS THE BEST WAY TO OVERCOME THE ADDICTION OF THIS DRUG?

Don't use Methadone at all due to its addictive nature! It's only effective if used in a controlled environment. There are other effective methods of detoxing which we offer. Psycho-social sessions and therapy is very important. Detoxing is necessary but staying off is another concern. Sessions on relapse prevention, coping mechanisms, goal settings, building relationships etc. are vitally important for the patient to understand so that they can maintain their sober status.

WHAT DRUG DOES ADFUSE TO HELP ADDICTS RECOVER?

Anti-craving meds called Naltrexone together with psycho-social therapy sessions after detoxing is the most effective method of rehabilitation that we use. Naltrexone has an anti-craving and non-addictive component which is specifically composed to eliminate cravings. It was originally designed to combat alcohol addiction, and now serves as a detoxification tool used internationally by heroin addicts.

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


